Healthy Active Learning Initiative

Since our professional learning day on 31st July, teachers have engaged with the Movewell Resource and have integrated brain boosters and Māori games into their daily planning.

We have had two 'play scans' from our involvement with the Healthy Active Learning initiative. Our facilitators have observed our children play (the equipment they use, the spaces that they utilise and the spaces that may be under utilised). They have talked to our learners and gathered their feedback about 'play' at Whakamārama School. We are looking forward to their analysis of our learners' feedback and the possibilities of funding that we can draw on as part of the initiative.

Planting Day

Room 1 learners were involved in helping create an ecological corridor between Pāhoia and Ōmokoroa on Wednesday 16th August by planting native trees along the edge of the new cycleway.

Taking action alongside the Western Bay of Plenty Council, our tamariki and our amazing helpers got stuck in and managed to plant nearly 2000 trees, plants and bushes. A huge achievement! Our learners and adult volunteers were thrilled to be able to help our environment thrive for our native bird species.















WBOP Hockey Festivals

It was super to see 23 of our learners put their hand up to take part in this year's hockey festivals at Tauranga Hockey. We had 14 students play at the Year 3 / 4 festival day on Tuesday 15th August and 9 students play at the Year 5 / 6 festival day on Tuesday 22nd August. Participation in such events provides real learning opportunities for our children to try something new and engage in an activity that can have both the elements of competition and fun. The school acknowledges our learners for their teamwork and sportsmanship on the day.




PTA Tea Towel Fundraiser
