Te Wiki o te Reo Māori

Te Wiki o te Reo Māori aims to inspire New Zealanders to speak the Māori language proudly. To mark this event, ngā kaiako continued to integrate te reo Māori into their class programmes, as well as introduce new kupu (words / phrases) for our tamariki. On Tuesday 12th September / Ko te Rātu te tekau mā rua o Mahuru, our tamariki moved around a rotation of activities that focused on te reo Māori. Our tuakana (older) supported our teina (younger) as they participated in the learning across the morning. Great job! Ka pai tō mahi!

Bay Conservation Education Field Trip

Another great day of hands-on experiential conservation education with our facilitators from Bay Conservation Alliance and the team from Project Parore on Friday 8th September. Our Year 4-8 learners planted native trees in order to protect and restore our waterways, surveyed the presence of earthworms in the soil and deepened their learning about pest animal control. Attendance

Our goal, and the Ministry of Education goal, is ākonga attending school regularly (90% attendance, which means only having one day off every fortnight). Days absent, days late, it all adds up! The below statistics

are informed by NZ data. The below statistics are definitely something to think about. The below statistics tell a story about the absence and lateness of our learners. Seeing these numbers definitely brings about a sense of reality to absenteeism and lateness.

1 or 2 days off school per week might not seem much but...
