Orienteering

Orienteering is an outdoor adventure sport that exercises both the mind and body. On Monday 16th October, a group of Year 5 / 6 students were introduced to orienteering with Dennis from OBOP (Orienteering Bay of Plenty). It was great to see our learners try a

new sport and start developing their orienteering skills through map reading.

The morning involved learning how to read maps and ended with navigating around the school between control points marked on a unique school map. Compasses were not

necessary for our beginners and they soon started to master map reading skills.



Show Day

Show Day Pets

- Children MUST be involved in the nurturing of their pet. All children entering will be required to verbally share their 'learning journey' their involvement with their animal.
- If you are bringing a pet but have not yet returned your pet notice please do so ASAP
- Any pets brought to show day must have access to food and water and be handled / kept in such a way that they are not subjected to stress or fear.
- Lambs and goats will be judged on the school field. Lambs and goats are not permitted in the courtyard outside Rooms 2 & 3.
- Small pets can be set up in the courtyard (outside Rooms 3, 2 & 4), where they will have access to shade across the morning.
- Judging will commence at 10:00 am (ish \bigcirc)
- Lambs and goats are to be tethered in the shade after judging. The trees at the front of the school are ideal.

IF YOU ARE CONSIDERING EXPRESSING INTEREST IN ATTENDING SCHOOL CAMP, IT IS VITAL THAT YOU COMPLETE A VETTING CONSENT FORM THIS WEEK AND BRING IN TWO FORMS OF IDENTIFICATION THAT CAN BE SIGHTED. THIS INCLUDES PARENTS THAT MAY HAVE A CURRENT POLICE VET WITH ANOTHER ORGANISATION. VETTING CAN TAKE UP TO 20 WEEKS SO THIS IS A TIGHT TIMEFRAME.

A vetting form can be collected from the office or you can ring / email the office to ask for a form to come home in your child's bag.

Board of Trustees Casual Vacancy

A casual vacancy has occurred on the school board for an elected parent representative. The board has decided to fill the vacancy by selection. If 10% or more of eligible voters on the school roll ask the board, within 28 days of this notice being published, to hold a by-election to fill the vacancy, then a by-election will be held.

Attendance

Repeat, repeat and repeat again! We cannot emphasise enough the importance of regular school attendance.

If your child is going to be absent, it is important that you notify the school, <u>along with a reason</u>. This can be done:

- through the school website absence form,
- on our School App or
- by phoning the school office

If your child needs to visit the doctor or dentist, these appointments should firstly be made outside of school hours. We understand from time to time this may not be possible.

Should you be planning a domestic or overseas trip, we ask that these be taken during the school holidays, however, we know this is not always possible, therefore, we ask that you formally request 'approved leave' by emailing the principal (principal@whakamarama.school.nz) with your holiday details.

Our goal, and the Ministry of Education goal, is ākonga attending school regularly (90% attendance, which means only having one day off every fortnight). Days absent, days late, it all adds up! The below statistics are informed by NZ data. The below statistics are definitely something to think about. The below statistics tell a story about the absence and lateness of our learners. Seeing these numbers definitely brings about a sense of reality to absenteeism and lateness.

1 or 2 days off school per week might not seem much but...
