Attendance

Being engaged in learning matters, right from a child's first days in early learning, throughout primary schooling and secondary schooling. Aotearoa New Zealand's children need every opportunity to learn, participate, and flourish by regularly attending school.

WE CANNOT EMPHASISE ENOUGH THE IMPORTANCE OF REGULAR SCHOOL ATTENDANCE.







If your child is going to be absent, it is important that you notify the school, <u>along with a reason</u>. This can be done:

- through the school website absence form,
- on our School App or
- by phoning or emailing the school office

If your child needs to visit the doctor or dentist, these appointments should firstly be made outside of school hours. We understand from time to time this may not be possible.

Should you be planning a domestic or overseas trip, we ask that these be taken during the school holidays, however, we know this is not always possible, therefore, we ask that you formally request 'approved leave' by emailing the principal (principal@whakamarama.school.nz) with your holiday details.

Our goal, and the Ministry of Education goal, is ākonga attending school regularly (90% attendance, which means only having one day off every fortnight). Days absent, days late, it all adds up! The below statistics are informed by NZ data. The below statistics are definitely something to think about. The below statistics tell a story about the absence and lateness of our learners. Seeing these numbers definitely brings about a sense of reality to absenteeism and lateness.

Stationery

Your child will have received their stationery list alongside this newsletter for the year. Please note that the school does not make money on these stationery items but wishes to bring to you quality stationery

products that are discounted at the beginning of each year. It is important that your child has the correct books as items on the list are suited to the developmental needs of our learners. If you pay for your child's stationery online, can you please make sure that you send back the stationery list so we know what items you may have deleted from purchasing.

Dropping Off, Picking Up and Parking

When picking up or dropping off, you have the option of parking at the Whakamārama Community Centre across the road OR using the bus bay.

The bus bay located outside the school is for '**pick up and drop off only'**. If you choose to use the bus bay for pick up at the end of the day, please remain in your vehicle and the teacher on duty will

direct your child / children to you for boarding. Parents use the bus bay as a quick pick up zone. As the end of the bus bay is on a bend, please do not reverse out of the rear of the bus bay.

The school car park is for staff only - no drop off or end of day pick up in the staff car park. For student safety, we ask that you also avoid using the kindergarten driveway / space next to the driveway as a drop off and pick up point for your child / children.

If we all play our role with drop off and pick up, together we reduce the number of areas in which traffic is merging from, and thus increase the safety for all \bigcirc

Reading Together Programme

This term we will be running the Reading Together Programme. 'Reading Together' is a research-based workshop programme which helps parents/whānau to provide effective support for their children's reading. The programme has been shown to raise children's reading achievement in a significant and sustained manner, and to improve relationships between children and parents, and between parents and teachers.

'Reading Together' provides effective support for all children and their parents / whānau - children who struggle with reading, or are reluctant to read, or reading competently.

The Reading Together workshops will provide you with practical strategies for you to use at home. The programme consists of four workshops – each 1 hour and 15 minutes long. Keep an eye out for further information coming home soon.


