UPDATE ON COVID-19 Protection Framework (CPF): Settings prohibited from requiring evidence of vaccination

Ministers have agreed that there are certain settings where denying entry on the basis of vaccination status will be prohibited. These settings are in regard to life-preserving services and being able to access these services (e.g. public transport). The settings also include the right to access education - YAY!

As a result, all registered schools (including private schools), all school hostels (including private hostels), and all school transport services (for all students) will be prohibited from requiring proof of vaccination (either via My Vaccine Pass or other tool) as a condition of using or accessing education.

This prohibition will apply to all our students and you as parents / caregivers. This means that a person's vaccination status should not restrict learning for our children. Neither should it restrict you as parents and caregivers from supporting your children in their learning.

Other settings where entry cannot be denied on the basis of vaccination states include public transport, supermarkets, dairies, pharmacies, petrol stations and essential health and disability services.

Other events and activities

There are situations where requiring evidence of vaccination is not prohibited. In situations where events and activities occur on school grounds and where participants extend beyond staff, parents, caregivers and learners, it may be appropriate for us to ask for a vaccine certificate. Examples of this are fundraising events, concerts and other community events. Third-party users of our facilities will be required to show evidence of vaccination.

Please note, these decisions by Ministers will be reflected in an Order once the enabling legislation has been passed. We will therefore be able to provide you with further information after the Order is confirmed.

Plans for COVID-19 vaccination of children aged 5 – 11 years old

Medsafe, New Zealand's Medicines and Medical Devices Safety Authority, is currently considering an application to use a child version of the Pfizer vaccine for 5-11 year olds, and the BOP District Health Board expects a decision in mid-December. Depending upon Medsafe's decision, before Christmas the Cabinet could make a decision to vaccinate children using the child version of the Pfizer vaccine.

Health officials are planning for a rollout of child doses of the Pfizer vaccine starting early next year.


