Annual Goals for 2024

In 2023, the Board engaged and consulted to understand what makes our school unique and what should be strengthened to help our tamariki, our children, succeed. The voice of students, teachers, staff, board, parents, whānau, iwi, community members and external agencies was heard.

We used a range of relevant feedback that we gathered as part of a robust internal self review. This feedback was moderated against the following National Legislative requirements and priorities to support us to 'sift and find' what really mattered for us to focus on over the next 2-3 years.

Bay Conservation Alliance

We are extremely fortunate that our involvement with Bay Alliance Conservation continues into 2024. Our Year 4-8 learners enjoyed their first visit in-class session on Thursday 15th February. This term they are learning about the importance of estuaries and the plants and animals that call the estuary home. Estuaries face many challenges, including sediment and marine pest animals. Fortunately, we can all help to solve these problems so we can continue to enjoy being in and around our estuaries. We will be learning lots more when out on our field trip in a few weeks.



Garden to Table

Through the 'Garden to Table' programme, Whakamārama School aims to teach our learners the essential skills they need to be food-resilient. We wish to see our learners enthusiastically getting their hands dirty and learning how to grow, harvest, prepare and share fresh, seasonal food. Our purpose, along with the 'Garden to Table' programme, is to empower our children with a love of good, fresh food and the skills they need to grow and prepare it; that will have a transformative and lifelong impact on their health and wellbeing.

We are now into the fourth year of Garden to Table \bigcirc This term - Room 4 learners. Across the last two weeks they have been busy harvesting, weeding, watering, pruning and of course - knife safety skills and cooking! Zucchini slice, roasted cabbage slaw, asian cucumber, plum cakes, zucchini and cauliflower fritters

with tzatziki dressing are just some of the delights that our learners' taste buds have encountered. Great to see our learners trying foods!



Board Investment Updates

Some of you may have noticed the upgrades that took place at the end of 2023 or across the summer break

Through the fundraising efforts of parents / whānau from cross country and show day 2023, the board was able to invest in forum group tables for Room 4 (\$4,400). Room 4 is loving their new furniture. The board also invested in the supply and install of a hot water heater in the tech room (\$2,000), Chromebook device upgrade for our Year 2 students (\$3,500) and forum high tables for the tech room / garden to table room (\$3,800).

Playground Loose Parts

Our tamariki love putting their creativity into play. They love loose parts (materials to to build, create, construct and deconstruct) and they love using PE equipment for any purpose other than what it is meant for \bigcirc

Phones away for the day

All state schools / kura are required to implement a phone rule that has student phones 'away for the day' as soon as possible in Term 1 2024 and no later than the start of Term 2 2024. This is not applicable to us, as we don't have any children bringing phones to school \bigcirc Our policy will be updated inline with the new legislation and shared with you as soon as it is released.

• 'One hour a day' teaching requirement

From the beginning of Term 1 2024, schools / kura with students in years 0-8 will spend an average of one hour a day teaching each reading, writing, and maths. This could be in dedicated lessons, and in other learning areas as students read and write and engage with a variety of purposes and contexts. In our school, there is little change. So much of our learning is integrated, and cross-curricular learning opportunities will remain important.
