Wild About NZ Environmental Group

With the support of Tammy Bruce, Wild about New Zealand, our students are provided with the opportunity to help turn the tide for our native wildlife. Across term 1 the environmental group has been learning about stream health; with a particular focus on our local taonga - Puketoki Reserve.

Tuesday 13th April hosted an opportunity for the group to present their learning to Room 3 learners through drama.

School Camp: 10th November - 13th November

Traditionally, Whakamarama School students have had the opportunity annually to attend an overnight camp for 2-3 nights where a range of outdoor activities are offered as part of our outdoor education curriculum.

For 2021, we have been lucky enough to attain a space at 'Camp Raglan', and the Board has approved for this camp to go ahead. We are currently planning for this to be a whole school camp but this may change.

The Board is aware that payment cannot be enforced, however, the reality is that unless parents support school camp by making a 'donation' the school would not be able to continue to have camps in the future or the entire structure around school camps would need changing.

To support planning, a questionnaire will come out early term 2 to ascertain who is able to make a \$180 'donation' towards their child attending the camp. Knowing about camp now provides you with sufficient warning to start setting some money aside for this expenditure - setting aside \$7.00 per week / per child will have your 'donation' covered by 10th November if you start from the beginning of Term 2.

Teacher Only Days

Arising from the employment agreement negotiations for the Primary Teachers' Collective Agreement and the Primary Principals' Collective Agreement, it was agreed that any one principal or teacher is entitled to a maximum of eight teacher-only days.

These days are to provide teachers and principals with additional time to:

- Refresh and deepen their knowledge and practice around the local curriculum (within the context of the removal of national standards);
- Strengthen their understanding of the use of assessment tools for learning and teaching;
- Respond to the recommendations of the education work programme in the Curriculum, Progress and Achievement (CPA) Report;
- Familiarise themselves with curriculum work changes that will become available over the term of the collective agreements.







