#### What have our teachers been learning?

Whakamārama School staff and teachers are constantly learning and working to improve their practice. Across the term, our team has been involved in an array of wonderful learning opportunities.



Programmes for Students (PfS): ALiM (Accelerating Learning in Mathematics). Our teachers are lucky to be receiving mentor support from Jo Matthews. Jo's expertise is providing professional learning and development in Mathematics. She has extensive experience supporting school wide development and change in the leading, learning and teaching of Mathematics and Statistics in order to improve learning for students.

### Literacy

Through a professional learning group, our teachers have worked together in a collaborative, interactive and ongoing way in order to improve teacher practice and outcomes for students (with a specific focus on writing). As a team, we are working towards documenting what an effective literacy classroom looks like across our kura.

Tūhuratia te Iho Pūmanawa; Addressing Bias and Stereotyping in Teaching Practice Through an online webinar with Core Education, our teachers were were supported to:

- Understand the relationship between teacher expectations and ability grouping/streaming, and how it can impact ākonga achievement.
- Appreciate the advantages of mixed-ability teaching, including high-expectation teaching, for enhancing ākonga achievement.
- Identify key behaviours of high-expectation teachers and gain practical insights into effective mixed-ability teaching practices.

Learning is our core business - both for us and our tamariki!

#### **Garden to Table**

A huge thank you to all our volunteers that have given their time, skills, and experience to support the ongoing success of the Garden to Table programme at our kura. Across the term you have helped empower Room 1 & 4 tamariki to grow, harvest, prepare, and share great food!

#### Yummy Apple Stickers

Our school is registered in the Yummy Fruit Company school sticker promotion. School families are encouraged to collect the YUMMY stickers off their fruit and collect the YUMMY cut out labels from bags of fruit (each label is worth 10 stickers).
