It's fantastic to welcome our tamariki, staff and parents back for Term 2. We hope everyone had a super two weeks with their children at home. The staff and I are feeling refreshed and ready for the term ahead.

Bay Conservation: Te Ngāhere / The Forest

Aotearoa was once covered in native forest that provided a habitat for our special flora and fauna. Now, due to habitat loss and pest invasion, this habitat is under threat and needs our help. Aongatete is a precious lowland forest in a unique mountain and coastal landscape. Hosting a unique mix of plants, birds, reptiles and invertebrates whose northern or southern limits meet here, it's significant as almost all Kaimai forest of this type has been converted to farmland. Aongatete Forest Project has been protecting 500 hectares of native forest since 2006, using traps and bait stations to protect the rare plants and animals that live there. They are a completely volunteer operation.

On Friday 28 April, Rooms 1 & 4 had an in-class session with Bay Conservation Alliance. Our learners were introduced to conservation and the importance of looking after our forest (Ngāhere). They then moved around a rotation of activities covering the conservation status scale, our native kauri tree and ngā tamariki o Tāne (the children of Tane Mahuta). We will be following up our learning with a visit to Aongatete - a taonga, a treasure, right on our back door step. We have no doubt that our tamariki will be guardians, kaitiaki, for our environment into the future.







Winter Sport

Words from attendance letter received from Hon Jan Tinette

"School attendance has declined over the past decade, and COVID-19 has made things worse. This means our children and young people are missing out on learning, friendships and connections with their classmates and kaiako. We all have a role to play in ensuring our young people are attending and engaging in their education. We know from research conducted by ERO that 41% of parents think it's okay for their child to miss a week of school a term. I strongly encourage you to remind parents and whānau of the importance of their child attending school every day unless they are sick".

New attendance officer roles designed:

The Ministry has completed the design process for 82 new attendance officer roles, in consultation with our peak body representatives. These roles are designed to work within schools with students who have irregular or moderate absences. This means they will typically support students missing 5-15 days of school in a term. They will work with clusters of schools, students and whanau on strategies to achieve regular attendance. The contract process is underway, and it is expected the roles will be in place in Term 2 this year.
